

I was impressed by his candidness, and found I related to him on struggles with sexual brokenness. I had ended up entering into a relationship with a girl who was aware of my same-sex attractions, and it was a difficult season for us both, so I sought out counsel and direction from Frank, for I knew he was married now, despite his sexual confusion and brokenness from the past. We met several times, and he played a key role in helping me form and re-shape my view of biblical masculinity and sexual purity. Although we no longer meet together, Frank has always been there for me when I needed him and prayerfully speaks into my life on occasion when necessary.

He is very insightful, though abstract, a motivator and outside-the-box, detailed thinker. He is very in-tune with the spirit of God, and I believe it would be acceptable to say that he is often thinking, at times speaking, in another realm. Frank meditates and quotes Scripture as if it a natural part of conversation, and I believe it plays a significant role in the continual healing and sustaining work of Christ in his life.
