Frank King was a student in an upper level literature class I teach at Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, Illinois. The name of the class was "Images of Christ in the Novel," and in it we studied a variety of novels to see how the author had represented the archetypal image of the figure of Christ with a view to comparing that image to the biblical Christ of the Gospels.

In addition to reading eight novels, the class also covered poetry, essays and film. The student was also required to write a number of short papers as well as a major interpretation of an additional novel from a bibliography provided for the class. That interpretive analysis could be either an essay or an art work or a combination of both. Finally the student had to write a short piece on the representation of the image of Christ in stained glass windows in a Chicago church (they could choose from a list) known for its windows.

Frank was always a conscientious engaged student who read carefully, almost painstakingly, joined the discussions readily and showed great respect for both me as the professor and for the academic process. His papers were always thoughtful, and his final project was the combination of computer-generated art and writing.

Frank works hard, is very creative, and is interested in learning. He is attentive, respects authority but remains thoughtful and processes the material in substantial ways.
